Working with the City of Mitcham ...

Council has completed the reengineering of the rocky creek near Grand Boulevard Bridge and the boggy path west of the bridge. What do you think about the transformation?

Council has upgraded its maintenance in Woodlake Drive Reserve, recently mowing the winter grass (week of 15 September), installing a protective fence near the Duck Pond and new plants in the Grand Boulevard planting bed. What do you think of these Council initiatives?

Council has approved the WRAG Street Library which will soon be installed near the Rotunda – Bring a book and borrow a book... and stay a while in the park to read a few pages and enjoy the serenity.

Action in the Park

The Nature Trail 2025 & Sensory Garden

...With a Green Adelaide Grant of \$64k, WRAG began the transformation of Woodlake Drive and the Wetlands Reserves in June. Seventy residents, volunteers and students helped Trees for Life plant 450 tube stock over 3 days. Most of the tiny plants have survived a very cold winter and nibbling birds and are now happily settling into their new habitat. We had to make some modifications to the Sensory Garden to help the rainwater drain through the mulch.

WRAG is busy planning the 2026 plantings with the help of Trees for Life and the Mitcham Council. 665 tube stock have been ordered and 8 sites approved. Planting dates for June or July 2026 will be confirmed soon - so stay tuned and get the dates in your diary. We will need many volunteers to help.

Working Bees...WRAG began weed management and a cleanup in Woodlake Drive Reserve with a Working Bee on Saturday 18 October.
